2. LEARN

2.1 KEY POINTS

There are rivers, lakes, waterfalls, dams, parks, botanical gardens, valleys and mountains around us. Some of these places are well known across the world and some of these places could be a favourite place to visit for the locals. Knowing their names and reason why these places are liked by people would help children to understand the importance of such places and respect nature as well.

3. ENGAGE

3.1 INTEREST GENERATION ACTIVITY

INTRODUCTION OF THE TOPIC

Activity 1: Discussion about Lalbagh Botanical Garden *

Note: Choose any well-known place from your locality

Materials required: NA

Prerequisites: NA

Activity flow:

- Initiate a discussion by asking children if they have ever visited the Lalbagh garden. If yes, with when did they visit, with whom did they go there and what was their experience like.
- Allow children to share their experience with others in the class.
- For those who did not visit the place, summarise the discussion by describing how the garden is like, how big it is and what kinds of plants and trees are there in the garden.
- Alternatively, arrange for a visit to the place and let children experience the place themselves by touching the plants (if allowed), listening to the sounds, smelling the flowers and feeling the breeze.

3.2 CONCEPT GENERATION ACTIVITY

WELL KNOWN PLACES IN THE LOCALITY

Activity 2: List out the well known places in the locality *

Materials required: NA

Prerequisites: NA

Activity flow:

The teacher would make a list of well known places that are there in the locality beforehand. Describe the places to children and let children guess the name of the place.

The places could be:

- River
- Water falls
- Dam
- Lake
- Botanical garden
- Sea beach
- Mountain peak
- Famous bridge
- National park
- Fields with crops

Describe the places and discuss why these places are famous.

Activity 3: Write the names of well known places in the locality

Materials required: Writing materials

Prerequisites: Students should be able to write in braille

Activity flow:

Encourage children to make a list of all the names learnt in the previous activity by writing them on their writing sheet. Help them with the spellings and ask them to read out the names once they complete writing the names.

3.3 LET'S DISCUSS: RELATE TO DAILY LIFE

Encourage children to talk about their experiences of visiting any of the well known places in the locality. Ask what they learnt from those visits. What did they like the most in such places? Is there anything that they did not like? If yes, then why?
